

## DAVID A. PIETZ

David Pietz is Regents Professor of History, UNESCO Chair in Environmental History, and Director of the School for Global Studies at the University of Arizona (USA). His research focuses on environmental and technological history of modern China with a particular focus on water management. His current project, "Death and Life on the Yangtze: Extinction, Conservation, and Environmental Change in Modern China" explores the extinction of the Yangtze River Baiji dolphin and its aftermath. Publications include *The Yellow River: The Problem of Water in Modern China* (Harvard; Cecil B. Curry Book Award), *Engineering the State: The Huai River and Reconstruction in Nationalist China* (Routledge), *Water and Human Societies* (co-editor, Palgrave), and *State and Economy in Republican China* (co-editor, Harvard Asia Center). His research has been supported by the Guggenheim Foundation, the Carnegie Foundation, National Science Foundation, the National Endowment for the Humanities, the Mellon Foundation, the American Philosophical Society, and the Institute for Advanced Studies (Princeton).
